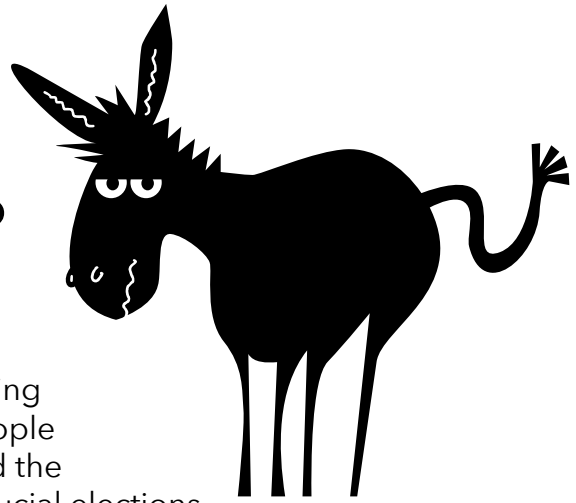


Who do you know? A Networking Worksheet
